Emergency bag (example)

Approx. 15 kg for men, approx. 10 kg for women.

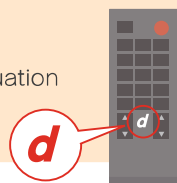
Agui Town Website

Safety Confirmation and Contact Methods

If there are issues making phone calls during a disaster, you can use the Disaster Message Dial or Disaster Message Board.

Disaster Message Board

Open "Disaster Message Board" on your mobile phone company's website.

How to Leave a Message

How to Read a Message

Select "Add" (登録)
Enter a message (up to 100 characters)

Select "Check" (確認)
Enter the cell phone number of the person whose message you want to check, then read it.

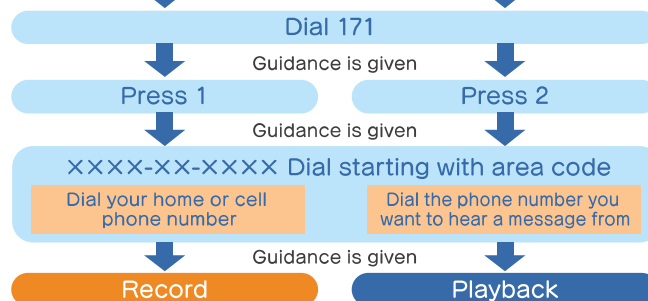

- Recording time: 30 seconds per message
- Storage period: 2 days (48 hours) after recording
- Number of stored messages: 1 to 10 messages per phone number

*Number of messages stored, storage period, etc. will vary depending on disaster situation.

What to do after arriving at an evacuation shelter

In the event of a disaster, there will be many people at evacuation shelters and there is likely to be disorder and confusion at the time of opening the shelters. Everyone's cooperation is needed to help the smooth operation of shelters.

1. Registering at the reception desk

(Also serves as a way to confirm your safety)
Fill out an "Evacuation shelter User Registration Form" for each household at the reception desk. (*)
If you need special considerations while staying at the evacuation shelter, inform the staff at the time of registration.



2. Assignment of residence

Compartments are assigned according to family organization. It is recommended to keep a space of at least 1 to 2 meters between compartments to prevent infection.



3. Sharing roles and participating in evacuation shelter operations

It is important to create a system in which many people can actively participate in the operation of the shelter, including men and women, young and old.



Checking information on the bulletin board

Take a look at bulletin boards at the entrances and reception areas of evacuation shelters for official notices from the town, rules and living information for the evacuation shelter, status of water, electric and gas restoration, and safety information.

*If you have registered as an evacuation shelter user, you can receive supplies even if you are currently located outside of the shelter but have evacuated status (home evacuation, sleeping in a car, etc.).

Rules and Manners at Evacuation Shelters

Life in an evacuation shelter can be a burden, especially for those who require special care, due to issues such as hygiene and privacy. Everyone in the shelter should help each other and aim to be flexible in accommodating a wide range of needs.

Supply distribution

Follow staff instructions when receiving supplies.

Restroom use

In the event of a power outage or water cutoff, be sure to use the restrooms in the prescribed manner.
Take turns cleaning the restrooms so that everyone can use them comfortably.

Garbage removal

Separate trash according to the rules of the evacuation shelter, and put trash into designated bags. Tie the bags tightly, and put them together in the designated areas.

Cigarettes and Alcohol

Smoking and drinking are not permitted in the evacuation shelter.



Crime Prevention

Be aware of crimes such as theft, fraud, sex crimes, and forced sales in the shelter, and if you see anyone suspicious, contact a police officer or shelter staff.

To minimize crime against women during chaotic disaster situations, it is recommended not to wear clothes that make you identifiable as a woman. Instead, consider wearing a hat or taking other precautions to protect yourself.

Countermeasures against infectious diseases

Wash hands and gargle to prevent contracting infectious diseases. If you do contract one, wear a mask and be considerate about coughing to avoid passing it on to others. In addition, be sure to regularly ventilate the room, set up partitions and other efforts.



Sleeping in a car

Sleeping in a car carries the risk of economy class syndrome and carbon monoxide poisoning. The town office will inform you in case that it is necessary to accept sleeping in a car to prevent the spread of infection in shelters.

This app from Agui Town delivers safe and reliable information. In the event of a disaster or emergency, life-saving information is delivered to your smartphone. In Japanese only.

How to use

Install the "Life Vision" app and do the initial setup.



Information is delivered via push notifications. In addition to text, notifications with audio and images are also available.
