平成17年度より、「欠落なき」「落差なき」「段差なき」教育を求めて、町内のすべての幼稚園、保育園、小学校、中学校が15歳のあるべき生徒像を目標に研究実践に取り組んでいます。町内一斉のあいさつ運動により地域との絆を育むことや、町内統一のカリキュラムを用いて教育活動の充実を図っています。11月2日を「あぐい教育の日」と制定し、平成25年に3回目の全国発表を行っています。

Since 2005, we have aimed for an educational system of "no dropouts, no fall-behinds, no grade level differences," and all the nursery schools, kindergartens, elementary schools, and junior high schools in the town have worked to educate ideal pupils by age 15. We are perfecting our educational system, building community bonds through the all-town greeting movement and putting into practice a unified standard town curriculum. Nov. 2 was set as "Agui Education Day," and in 2013, for the third time, a national announcement was issued.










阿久比スポーツ村 Agui Sports Village


